

## Summer LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

After 17 years of focus on our school-year program, in July of 2018 Vido Verde ran its first ever Summer Leadership Program, a camp for highschool-aged participants from low-income Bay Area Schools.

Carlos, an alumnus of Vida Verde's School Year Program and Inaugural Summer Leadership Program, shared the following thoughts with the audience at Vida Verde's 2018 Benefit & Celebration Brunch:



I first came to Vida Verde when I was 10, and it really opened my eyes to the natural world since I was only accustomed to the city with lots of buildings with few trees. I remember being surprised by EVERYTHING. When I went on my 5th grade trip, I remember how I loved and admired the accepting and caring environment that was set up for the campers and teachers that went on that trip. I wanted to come back this summer now that I'm 16 because I wanted to experience that same type of environment again as an older kid with a better understanding of the world and people. I think about how many eyes have been opened because of Vida Verde—both of my sisters and some of my closest friends have experienced this immaculate program. My time at Vida Verde has showed me what my biggest assets are and how I can use them for the best future.
